Place 2 fingers in the middle of the chest and push down by 4cm (about 1.5 inches), which is approximately one-third of the chest diameter. The quality (depth) of chest compressions is very important. Use the heel of 1 hand if you can't achieve a depth of 4cm using the tips of 2 fingers.

In the United Kingdom, CPR may be withheld when clinical judgment concludes that CPR will not be able to restart the patient ' s heart and breathing and restore circulation; the benefits of CPR are agreed to be outweighed by the burdens and risks after careful discussion with the patient (or those close to the patient); a patient has an advanced decision (living will) or makes an informed decision to refuse CPR. w8

Give two breaths after every 30 chest compressions. If two people are conducting CPR, give two breaths after every 15 chest compressions. Perform CPR for about two minutes before calling for help unless someone else can make the call while you attend to the infant.
