Erano gli anni Settanta. Il primo stava preparando la sceneggiatura del film di Francesco Rosi sulla morte di Enrico Mattei, il presidente dell'Eni che osò sfidare le compagnie petrolifere internazionali. Il secondo stava scrivendo il romanzo *Petrolio*, una denuncia contro la destra economica e la strategia della tensione, di cui il poeta parlò anche in un famoso articolo sul "Corriere della Sera". De Mauro e Pasolini furono entrambi ammazzati. Entrambi avrebbero denunciato una verità che nessuno voleva venisse a galla: e cioè che

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con l'uccisione di Mattei prende il via un'altra storia d'Italia, un intreccio perverso e di fatto eversivo che si trascina fino ai nostri giorni. Sullo sfondo si staglia il ruolo di Eugenio Cefis, ex partigiano legato a Fanfani, ritenuto dai servizi segreti il vero fondatore della P2. Il "sistema Cefis" (controllo dell'informazione, corruzione dei partiti, rapporti con i servizi segreti, primato del potere economico su quello politico) mette a nudo la continuità eversiva di una classe dirigente profondamente antidemocratica, così come aveva capito e cercato di raccontare Pasolini in *Petrolio*, romanzo politico che invece fu letto solo in chiave letteraria. Before his mysterious murder in 1975, Pier Paolo Pasolini had become famous—and

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infamous—not only for his groundbreaking films and literary works but also for his homosexuality and criticism of capitalism, colonialism, and Western materialism. In *Pier Paolo Pasolini: Performing Authorship*, Gian Maria Annovi revisits Pasolini's oeuvre to examine the author's performance as a way of assuming an antagonistic stance toward forms of artistic, social, and cultural oppression. Annovi connects Pasolini's notion of authorship to contemporary radical artistic practices and today's multimedia authorship. Annovi considers the entire range of Pasolini's work, including his poetry, narrative and documentary film, dramatic writings, and painting, as well as his often scandalous essays on politics, art, literature, and theory. He interprets Pasolini's multimedia authorial performance as a masochistic act to elicit rejection, generate hostility, and highlight the contradictions that structure a repressive society. Annovi shows how questions of authorial self-representation and self-projection relate to the artist's effort to undermine the assumptions of his audience and criticize the conformist practices that the culture industry and mass society impose on the author. Pasolini reveals the critical potential of his spectacular celebrity by using the author's corporeal or vocal presence to address issues of sexuality and identity, and through his strategic self-fashioning in films, paintings, and

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photographic portraits he destabilizes the audience's assumptions about the author.

The importance of oil for national military-industrial complexes appeared more clearly than ever in the Cold War. This volume argues

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that the confidential acquisition of geoscientific knowledge was paramount for states, not only to provide for their own energy needs, but also to buttress national economic and geostrategic interests and protect energy security. By investigating the postwar rebuilding and expansion of French and Italian oil industries from the second half of the 1940s to the early 1960s, this book shows how successive administrations in those countries devised strategies of oil exploration and transport, aiming at achieving a higher degree of energy autonomy and setting up powerful oil agencies that could implement those strategies. However, both within and outside their national territories, these two European countries had to confront the new Cold War balances and the interests of the two superpowers.

This book invites readers to think of Mediterranean cultures as interconnected worlds, seen in light of how they evolve, disappear, are reborn and perpetually transform.
